All wool to be at the Showgrounds no later than 4pm on Friday 8 January 2021.

Conditions:

1. All fleeces to be properly skirted as required by trade
2. The judge may, at their own discretion, change fleeces from one class to the correct class without prejudice to the Exhibitor. Exhibitors who have their exhibits changed to apply to the Steward in charge, who will advise where their exhibits have been placed
3. All fleeces must be the property of a bona fide farmer. It is not necessary that the Exhibitor be the breeder of the sheep
4. Fleeces are to be judged on the Society's recognized judging score card, and a card will be placed on each fleece by the Judge
5. Wool may not be removed without the Steward's consent
